### **Permission**

- PERMISSION = IT'S OK
  - Can
  - May
  - Could
  - allowed
  - may
  - Permitted
    - You're allowed to smoke in here.
    - You can to smoke in here.
    - You can smoke in here.
    - You can sit here, the seat is free.
      Could I open the window?
      May I ask a question?
- Can is more informal, may and permitted are more formal, and allowed is both formal and informal.
- For the past and future of "can," you can use **could / was allowed** (in the past) and **will be allowed** (in the future):

## Prohibition = IT'S NOT OK

You can't go into that restaurant without a tie.

You can't drive in this country unless you are over eighteen.

You mustn't use your phone in class.

'Can't' usually gives the idea of something that is against the rules. Mustn't usually means that it is the speaker who is setting the rule.

- mustn't

- Can't is more informal, mustn't and not permitted are more formal, and not allowed is both formal and informal.

# **Obligation = IT'S NECESSARY**

- 'Have to' shows that the obligation comes from someone else, not the speaker. This is usually referring to a rule or law.
- **Must** shows us that the obligation comes from the speaker. It isn't a law or a rule.

I have to work on Saturday.

They have to wear their uniforms at school.

- have to
- need to
- must
- required
- What's the difference?
- Must and required are more formal than have to and need to.
- Don't use "to" after "must."

#### **NO OBLIGATION = IT'S NOT NECESSARY**

- -don't have to
- -don't need to
- -not necessary
- -not required
- -optional
- What's the difference?
  - -Don't have to and don't need to are more informal. Not necessary, not required, and optional are more formal.
